THE CINEMATOGRAPH FILMS (STORAGE, EXHIBITION, AND RENTING) REGULATIONS 1929, AMENDMENT No. 2.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 3rd day of August, 1938.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Cinematograph Films Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Cinematograph Films (Storage, Exhibition, and Renting) Regulations 1929, Amendment No. 2.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Cinematograph Films (Storage, Exhibition, and Renting) Regulations 1929* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. Clause 2 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking the definition of operator and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

- "'Operator' means the person in charge of and actually engaged in the projection-room during the projection of cinematograph film."
- 4. Clause 18 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—
- "18. At all times when cinematograph film is being projected for the purposes of a public performance the projection-room shall be in charge of a person who is the holder of an operator's license issued under the Cinematograph Operators' Licensing Regulations 1938, and such person shall not leave the projection-room during such performance except in case of emergency and until he has assured himself that the projection is under competent supervision during his absence."
