



THE CINEMATOGRAPH FILMS (STORAGE, EXHIBITION, AND RENTING) REGULATIONS 1929, AMENDMENT NO. 3

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 19th day of June, 1946

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Cinematograph Films Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Cinematograph Films (Storage, Exhibition, and Renting) Regulations 1929, Amendment No. 3.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Cinematograph Films (Storage, Exhibition, and Renting) Regulations 1929* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. Clause 18 of the principal regulations, as substituted by clause 4 of the Cinematograph Films (Storage, Exhibition, and Renting) Regulations 1929, Amendment No. 2, is revoked, and the following substituted therefor :—

“ 18. (1) It shall be the duty of the licensee at all times when cinematograph film is being projected for the purposes of a public performance to ensure that an operator holding the appropriate license in that behalf under the Cinematograph Operators Licensing Regulations 1938† is in charge of the projection-room throughout the whole of each performance.

“ (2) Except in the case of illness or emergency, such operator shall not absent himself from the projection-room while the projection apparatus is in use.”
