**THE CINEMATOGRAPH FILMS (STORAGE, EXHIBITION,  
AND RENTING) REGULATIONS 1929,  
AMENDMENT NO. 4**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington, this 29th day of July 1953

Present:

**HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL**

PURSUANT to the Cinematograph Films Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Cinematograph Films (Storage, Exhibition, and Renting) Regulations 1929, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Cinematograph Films (Storage, Exhibition, and Renting) Regulations 1929\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 19 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding to paragraph (1) of subclause (1) the following proviso:

“Provided that the Chief Inspector may approve the use in the film-spool boxes on any cinematograph machine of a quantity of film exceeding 2,000 ft. where the film being projected is not of a highly inflammable nature and he is satisfied that the dispensation is reasonably necessary in the light of technical advances in the methods of projecting films and that any modifications to the cinematograph machine or its attachments to make it suitable for use with new projection techniques or systems comply with accepted standards of good practice in design and construction.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]*

These regulations provide for the use of larger film spools taking more than 2,000 ft. of film through the recent introduction of 3D projection using viewing glasses. Both cinematograph machines are required to project simultaneously, and the amendment will permit the use of larger film spools in order to avoid frequent blackouts during the changeover of reels.
