

THE CINEMATOGRAPH FILMS (STORAGE, EXHIBITION, AND RENTING) REGULATIONS 1929, AMENDMENT NO. 6

COBHAM, Governor-General

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 17th day of May 1961

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Cinematograph Films Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Cinematograph Films (Storage, Exhibition, and Renting) Regulations 1929, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Cinematograph Films (Storage, Exhibition, and Renting) Regulations 1929* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
- 2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting in its appropriate alphabetical order the following definition:
 - "Licensing Authority" means the Cinematograph Films Licensing Authority appointed under the Cinematograph Films Amendment Act 1960.
- 3. Subclause (1) of regulation 12 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "form No. 3", and substituting the words "form No. 3A".
- 4. Regulation 12 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 2 of the Cinematograph Films (Storage, Exhibition, and Renting) Regulations 1929, Amendment No. 5, is hereby amended by revoking paragraphs (d) and (e) of subclause (2), and substituting the following paragraphs:

"(d) Where it is proposed that a charge should be levied upon members of a society for admission to projections of film by that society, the Licensing Authority may in its discretion vary the charge or forbid the levying of any charge, and there shall be endorsed on the licence any such prohibition against levying a charge, or any subsequent revocation of any such

prohibition:

- "(e) Notwithstanding anything in paragraph (c) of this subclause, where a film society has been issued with a licence under this regulation, the society may from time to time make application to the Licensing Authority for approval of the holding by the society of a film festival for the purpose of bringing to public notice films of special interest from educational, artistic, or technical aspects of film production, either in the premises specified in the licence or in some other approved premises. Upon the approval of any such application, subject to such conditions as the Licensing Authority may think fit to impose, the licence issued under this regulation shall, for the duration of the festival, be deemed to be an exhibitor's licence for the purpose of the Cinematograph Films Act 1928 in relation to the premises in which the festival is to be held:"
- 5. Regulation 12 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 2 of the Cinematograph Films (Storage, Exhibition, and Renting) Regulations 1929, Amendment No. 5, is hereby further amended by omitting from paragraph (f) of subclause (2) the words "Theatre Licensing Officer", and substituting the words "Licensing Authority".
- 6. Regulation 23 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "Chief Inspector may impose as being in his opinion", and substituting the words "Licensing Authority, after considering the recommendations of the Chief Inspector, may impose as being in its opinion".

7. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 33, and substituting the following regulation:

"33. If the holder of any licence granted under these regulations fails to comply with any of the general or special conditions subject to which the licence is issued the licence may be revoked—

"(a) In the case of any exhibitor's or renter's licence, by the Licensing

Authority:

- "(b) In the case of any storage or projection licence, by the Chief Inspector."
- 8. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 34, the following heading and regulation:

"Oath or Affirmation of Fidelity and Secrecy

"35. The oath or affirmation of fidelity and secrecy required to be taken under paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 6 of the Cinematograph Films Amendment Act 1960 shall be in the Form No. 7A in the First Schedule hereto.

9. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking forms Nos. 1 to 7 in the First Schedule, and substituting the forms set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

This licence authorises the storage of a quantity of film not exceedingft at any one time.

This licence is issued subject to the condition that the licensee in respect of all films for the time being in his possession or under his control shall at all times comply with the requirements of Part I of the Cinematograph Films (Storage, Exhibition, and Renting) Regulations 1929, and subject also to the following special conditions, namely:

- 1. That the number of "quota" films to be acquired by the licensee during the currency of this licence shall not exceed 12.
- 2. That the licensee shall not enter into any agreement out of New Zealand with respect to the exhibition of cinematograph films in New Zealand, if such agreement, if made in New Zealand, would be in contravention of any of the provisions of Part V of the Cinematograph Films Act 1928, or if the effect of such agreement would be to restrict in any way any right of rejection or other right which an exhibitor would, by virtue of that Act, have if the agreement were made in New Zealand; and, further, that the licensee shall not, in the conduct of his business as a renter, receive or distribute films if he has reason to believe that in relation to such films any exhibitor has entered into an agreement out of New Zealand, with any person other than the renter, whereby he has been deprived of any right of rejection or other right that he would have had by virtue of the said Act if the agreement were made in New Zealand.

This licence, unless sooner surrendered or revoked, shall continue in force until the 31st day of December 19....., and shall then expire.

- B. Not more than sufficient film for one performance shall be kept in the projection room. All other film on the premises shall be kept in approved containers in an approved storage place.
- C. (1) Only films prepared on approved non-flam stock shall be projected.
 - (2) During screening, projection machines and sound-reproducing equipment shall be stationed in a room separate from the auditorium or in an approved projection booth.
 - (3) All leads, cables, and similar connectors to and from projection machines and sound-reproducing equipment shall be so run and permanently fixed as not to be liable to constitute an obstruction to the audience in any circumstances.
- D. Not fewer than 75 per cent of the number of "quota" films exhibited by the licensee during a licence year shall be films that have not previously been exhibited at any theatre within the city in which the above theatre is located.

All film permitted to be stored under authority of clause A above shall be kept in approved containers (exchange transport containers) held in an approved storage place at the theatre specified in clause A of the conditions of licence.

- C. Exhibitions shall not be given on more than two days per week in any one of the premises scheduled above nor in more than one of them on the same day.
- D. (1) Only films prepared on approved non-flam stock shall be projected.
 - (2) During screening, projection machines and sound-reproducing equipment shall be stationed in a room separate from the auditorium or in an approved projection booth.
 - (3) All leads, cables, and similar connectors to and from projection machines and sound-reproducing equipment shall be so run and permanently fixed as not to be liable to constitute an obstruction to the audience in any circumstance.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations are consequential on the establishment of the Cinematograph Films Licensing Authority by the Cinematograph Films Amendment Act 1960, and clarify the functions of the Authority.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 18 May 1961. These regulations are administered in the Department of Internal Affairs.
