



**THE CINEMATOGRAPH FILMS REGULATIONS 1968,  
AMENDMENT NO. 2**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 13th day of September 1976

Present:

**HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL**

PURSUANT to the Cinematograph Films Act 1961, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Cinematograph Films Regulations 1968, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Cinematograph Films Regulations 1968\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) Regulation 2 (2) of these regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1976.

(3) Except as otherwise provided by subclause (2) of this regulation, these regulations shall come into force on the day of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Prescribing period for applications for renewal of licences**—(1) An application for the renewal of an exhibitor's licence that is due to expire on the 30th day of September 1976 shall be made within the period commencing with the 16th day of September 1976 and expiring with the 30th day of September 1976.

(2) The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting in the principal regulations, after regulation 48, the following regulation:

**“48A. Applications for renewal of licences**—(1) An application for the renewal of a renter's licence shall be made during the period com-

mencing with the 1st day of December and ending with the 31st day of December preceding the date on which the licence is due to expire.

“(2) An application for the renewal of an exhibitor’s licence shall be made during the period commencing with the 1st day of September and ending with the 30th day of September preceding the date on which the licence is due to expire.”

**3. Fees payable on application for renewal of licences**—(1) The Second Schedule to the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 6 of the Cinematograph Films Regulations 1968, Amendment No. 1\*) is hereby amended by inserting under the heading “*Renters Licences*”, after the item “where the number of feature films acquired during the year exceeds 12”, the following item:

“For renewal of renters’ licences—The same fee that would be payable if the application for the renewal of the licence were an application for its issue.”

(2) The said Second Schedule (as so substituted) is hereby further amended by inserting under the heading “*Exhibitors’ Licences and Permits*”, after the item “Exhibitor’s permit (single) (Reg. 50)”, the following item:

“For renewal of exhibitors’ licences—The same fee that would be payable if the application for the renewal of the licence were an application for its issue.”

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations relate to renewal of licences.

Regulation 1 relates to the Short Title and commencement.

Regulation 2 prescribes the period in which applications for renewals of renters’ and exhibitors’ licences are to be made. In respect of exhibitors’ licences expiring on 30 September 1976 the period is 16 September to 30 September 1976. In subsequent years the period is 1 September to 30 September.

The period for the renewal of renters’ licences in each year is 1 December to 31 December.

Regulation 3 provides that the fee payable for the renewal of an exhibitor’s licence is the same as that prescribed for the issue of the licence.
