**THE CONTROLLED FISHERIES (GISBORNE ROCK LOBSTER
FISHERY) NOTICE 1980**

PURSUANT to section 118 of the Fisheries Act 1908, the Minister of Fisheries hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Controlled Fisheries (Gisborne Rock Lobster Fishery) Notice 1980.

(2) This notice shall come into force on the 14th day of April 1980.

2. Interpretation—(1) In this notice,—

“Gisborne rock lobster fishery” means the rock lobster fishery within New Zealand fisheries waters as defined on the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries Map No. 151 (File Reference 20/1/5) held in the Head Office of the said Ministry, being the fishery bounded—

(a) By the shore-line between East Cape and the Wairoa River entrance; and

(b) By a straight line from East Cape on a true compass bearing of 045°; and

(c) By a straight line from the Wairoa River entrance on a true compass bearing of 160°:

“Wairoa River entrance” means that point in the mouth of the Wairoa River at 39°04'S and 177°25'E.

(2) Words and expressions in this notice which are defined in Part I or Part II of the Fisheries Act 1908 have the meanings so defined.

3. Declaration of controlled fishery—The Gisborne rock lobster fishery is hereby declared to be a controlled fishery for the purposes of Part III of the Fisheries Act 1908.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice declares the Gisborne rock lobster fishery to be a controlled fishery on and from 14 April 1980. A special licence from the Fisheries Licensing Authority is required to fish in a controlled fishery.
