



## THE CONTROLLED FISHERIES (GISBORNE ROCK LOBSTER FISHERY) ORDER 1985

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 25th day  
of March 1985

PURSUANT to section 30 of the Fisheries Act 1983, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

---

### ORDER

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Controlled Fisheries (Gisborne Rock Lobster Fishery) Order 1985.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Interpretation**—In this order, the term “Gisborne rock lobster fishery” means the rock lobster fishery within New Zealand fisheries waters bounded—

- (a) By the mean high-water mark of that part of the shore of the North Island from East Cape Lighthouse (at 37°41.4'S and 178°32.8'E) to the Wairoa River entrance (at 39°04'S and 177°25'E); and
- (b) By a straight line from East Cape Lighthouse (at 37°41.4'S and 178°32.8'E) on a true compass bearing of 45°; and
- (c) By a straight line from the Wairoa River entrance (at 39°04'S and 177°25'E) on a true compass bearing of 160°.

**3. Declaration of controlled fishery**—(1) The Gisborne rock lobster fishery is hereby constituted and declared to be a controlled fishery for the purposes of Part III of the Fisheries Act 1983.

(2) The controlled fishery constituted under subclause (1) of this clause is hereby declared to be in substitution for the controlled fishery of the same name declared by the Controlled Fisheries (Gisborne Rock Lobster Fishery) Notice 1980\* and, notwithstanding the revocation of that notice by section 108 (4) of the Fisheries Act 1983, continued by section 30 (5) of that Act.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order redeclares the Gisborne rock lobster fishery to be a controlled fishery, but changes one boundary slightly to now commence from East Cape Lighthouse instead of East Cape. A reciprocal amendment to the boundaries of the Bay of Plenty rock lobster controlled fishery (which abuts the Gisborne fishery) is made in the Controlled Fisheries (Bay of Plenty Rock Lobster Fishery) Order 1985.
