

THE CONTROLLED FISHERIES (SOUTHERN ROCK LOBSTER FISHERY) NOTICE 1980

PURSUANT to section 118 of the Fisheries Act 1908, the Minister of Fisheries hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Controlled Fisheries (Southern Rock Lobster Fishery) Notice 1980.
 - (2) This notice shall come into force on the 30th day of June 1980.
- 2. Interpretation—(1) In this notice the term "Southern rock lobster fishery" means the rock lobster fishery within New Zealand fisheries waters, as defined on Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries Map No. 151 (File Reference 20/1/5) held in the Head Office of the said Ministry, bounded—
 - (a) By the shoreline (commencing in a southerly direction) from Long Point (46° 34′ 8″ S and 169° 35′ E) to Abut Head (43° 05′ 9″ S and 170° 16′ 2″ E); and
 - (b) By a straight line from Long Point on a true compass bearing of 135°; and
 - (c) By a straight line from Abut Head on a true compass bearing of 317°.
- (2) Words and expressions in this notice which are defined in Part I or Part III of the Fisheries Act 1908 have the meanings so defined.
- **3. Declaration of controlled fishery**—The Southern rock lobster fishery is hereby declared to be a controlled fishery for the purposes of Part III of the Fisheries Act 1908.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice declares the Southern rock lobster fishery to be a controlled fishery on and from 30 June 1980. A special licence from the Fisheries Licensing Authority is required to fish in a controlled fishery.
