PURSUANT to the Co-operative Companies Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title—This order may be cited as the Co-operative Fertiliser Supply Companies Order 1979.

2. Interpretation—For the purposes of this order, a company is a co-operative fertiliser supply company if its principal object is—

- (a) The supply of fertilisers for the use of its shareholders; or
- (b) The manufacture of fertilisers for supply to another company that—
 - (i) Has as its principal object the supply of fertilisers for the use of its shareholders; and
 - (ii) Holds at least 60 percent of the issued shares of the company.

3. Co-operative Companies Act 1956 to apply to co-operative fertiliser supply companies—Co-operative fertiliser supply companies are hereby declared to be co-operative companies for the purposes of the Co-operative Companies Act 1956.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order declares co-operative fertiliser supply companies (as defined in the order) to be co-operative companies for the purposes of the Co-operative Companies Act 1956.
