ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 28th day of July 1986

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to section 53 of the Commerce Act 1986, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Minister of Trade and Industry, who is satisfied that—

- (a) The goods described in the Schedule to this order will be supplied in a market in which competition is limited; and
- (b) It is desirable for the prices of the goods described in the Schedule to this order to be controlled in accordance with the Commerce Act 1986 in the interests of both users and consumers,—

hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title—This order may be cited as the Controlled Goods (Steel Pipes) Order 1986.
- 2. Commencement and expiry—(1) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of August 1986.

- (2) This order shall continue in force until the close of the 30th day of June 1987, and shall then expire.
- **3. Continuation of price control**—The prices for the goods described in the Schedule to this order shall be controlled in accordance with the Commerce Act 1986.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 August 1986, keeps under price control, until the close of 30 June 1987, steel pipes, including those made in the form of rectangular hollow sections, when manufactured and sold by New Zealand Steel Limited.
