



THE COOK ISLANDS CUSTOMS DUTIES ORDER 1942

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 23rd day of May, 1942.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1939, and section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1942, and section 302 of the Customs Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby determine as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Cook Islands Customs Duties Order 1942.

2. Subject to clause 3 of this Order, the date on and from which the duties provided for in section 3 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1939, and in Part I of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1942, shall be in force in the Cook Islands shall be the date of the enactment hereof, subject always to the provisions of section 652 of the Cook Islands Act, 1915.

3. The aforesaid duties shall be so in force subject to the following modification—namely, that the duty payable on black twist tobacco shall, notwithstanding this Order in Council, continue to be the duty provided for in the Order in Council made pursuant to section 8 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1934, on the 29th day of October, 1934.*
