Pursuant to section 302 of the Customs Act 1913 and section 6 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1961, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Cook Islands Customs Duties Order 1962, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Cook Islands Customs Duties Order 1962* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).
- (2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- 2. In its application to goods imported into or entered for home consumption in the Cook Islands, the Customs Tariff is hereby modified by omitting so much thereof as relates to item 332.100.1 (as set out in the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 4) 1964†), and substituting so much of the Schedule hereto as relates to item 332.100.1.
- 3. The Second Schedule to the principal order (as amended by the Cook Islands Customs Duties Order 1962, Amendment No. 2‡) is hereby amended by omitting so much thereof as relates to the items of Group 332 of the Customs Tariff, and substituting the heading, subheadings, items, and rates of duty set out in the Schedule hereto.
- 4. The Cook Islands Customs Duties Order 1962, Amendment No. 2‡, is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order increases by 2d. the rate of duty on motor spirit imported into the Cook Islands; but there is no increase in the rate of duty on motor spirit imported into Niue.
