**THE CHATHAM ISLANDS DUES REGULATIONS 1951,
AMENDMENT NO. 11**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 1st day of April 1974

THE HON. H. WATT PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Chatham Islands County Council Empowering Act 1936, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Chatham Islands Dues Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 11, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Chatham Islands Dues Regulations 1951* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1974.

2. Scale of dues—(1) Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (2), and substituting the following subclause:

“(2) Wherever in the said Schedule dues are made payable by the tonne, the tonnage shall be computed upon the tonne by measurement (being 1.11 cubic metres) or upon the tonne by weight, according to which mode of computation produces the larger sum.”

(2) The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking the Schedule thereto (as substituted by regulation 2 (1) of the Chatham Islands Dues Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 7), and substituting the Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations fix the scale of dues on goods imported into or exported from the Chatham Islands, converting to a metric basis those dues that are based on measurement. There is no alteration in the rates.
