

## THE COOK ISLANDS FRUIT CONTROL REGULATIONS 1937, AMENDMENT NO. 4

# COBHAM, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 13th day of November 1961

Pursuant to the Cook Islands Act 1915, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Cook Islands Fruit Control Regulations 1937, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Cook Islands Fruit Control Regulations 1937\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of July 1961.
- 2. (1) Regulation 1 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the definitions of the terms "fruit" and "producer" in paragraph (a) of subclause (3), and substituting the following definitions:
  - "'Fruit' means citrus fruit, bananas, and pineapples, and any product thereof, whether processed or not:
  - "'Producer' means any person who grows or processes fruit for export:".
- (2) Regulation 2 of the Cook Islands Fruit Control Regulations 1937, Amendment No. 3, is hereby consequentially revoked.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The principal regulations provide for the control of fruit produced for export in the Cook Islands other than Niue, "fruit" being defined as citrus fruit and bananas. These regulations extend the scope of the principal regulations to pineapples also.
