



**THE CUSTOMS IMPORT PROHIBITION (FRESH FRUIT) ORDER
1985**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 48 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition (Fresh Fruit) Order 1985.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1986.

2. Importation of fresh fruit—The importation of the goods specified in the Schedule hereto is hereby prohibited, except with the consent of the Minister of Customs and subject to such conditions as the Minister thinks fit to impose.

3. Revocation—The Customs Import Prohibition (Fresh Fruit) Order 1979* is hereby revoked.

PROHIBITED IMPORTS

Fresh oranges.
Fresh bananas.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 January 1986, retains the prohibition on the import of fresh oranges and bananas, except with the consent of the Minister of Customs, but removes the prohibition in respect of fresh grapes, pineapples, and other citrus fruits.
