## CUSTOMS IMPORT PROHIBITION ORDER, 1936, NO. 5.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council.

Date of enactment: 16th day of December, 1936.

Date of notification in Gazette: 17th day of December, 1936.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section 46 of the Customs Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition Order, 1936, No. 5.
- 2. The importation is prohibited, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs, of pumps and similar devices of kerbside, wharf, and portable types for distributing motor spirits, comprising any or all of the undermentioned components, whether or not in combination with other apparatus, viz., pumps, filters, electric motors or other power units, measuring devices, hose, discharge valves and nozzles, pedestals and cabinets, and also all parts specially suited for use with such pumps or devices.
- 3. This Order in Council shall come into force on the date of publication thereof in the Gazette.
