THE CUSTOMS IMPORT PROHIBITION ORDER, 1937, NO. 7.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council.

Date of enactment: 18th day of March, 1937.

Date of notification in Gazette: 24th day of March, 1937.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section 46 of the Customs Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and being of opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby order as follows.

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition Order, 1937, No. 7.
- 2. The importation is prohibited, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit to impose, of any onions.
- 3. This Order in Council shall come into force on the day following notification of the making thereof in the *Gazette*.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act, 1936.

These regulations are administered by the Customs Department, but applications for permits to import onions should be made in the first case to the Department of Agriculture, Wellington. (C. No. 166.)
