ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 26th day of
January, 1938.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to section 46 of the Customs Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition Order 1938, No. 1.
2. The importation is prohibited, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs, of second-hand blankets and rugs except—
 - (a) Blankets and rugs that form part of the personal effects of a person arriving in New Zealand from overseas ; and
 - (b) Blankets and rugs that are *bona fide* gifts from a person abroad to a person in New Zealand for his own use or for the use of members of his family.
3. This Order shall come into force on the day following notification of the making thereof in the *Gazette*.
