ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 8th day of March, 1938.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to section 46 of the Customs Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and being of opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition Order 1938, No. 2.
- 2. The importation is prohibited, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs, of used or second-hand saddlery and harness of all descriptions, and used or second-hand cattle and other animal rugs and covers.
- 3. Nothing in this Order shall affect the importation of saddlery, harness, rugs or covers used on any vessel in connection with any livestock introduced into the Dominion, the importation of which is restricted under the provisions of the regulations under the Stock Act, 1908, made on the 4th day of October, 1915.*
- **4.** This Order shall come into force on the day following notification of the making thereof in the *Gazette*.
