## THE CUSTOMS IMPORT PROHIBITION ORDER 1938, NO. 3.

## GALWAY, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 11th day of May, 1938.

## Present:

The Right Hon. M. J. Savage presiding in Council.

Pursuant to section 46 of the Customs Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and being of opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition Order 1938, No. 3.
- 2. The importation is prohibited, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs, of fresh fruit of any of the following kinds—namely, oranges, mandarin-oranges, grapefruit, lemons, and bananas.
- 3. This Order shall come into force on the day following notification of the making thereof in the *Gazette*.
