ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 23rd day of August, 1940.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to section 46 of the Customs Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of the opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition Order 1940, No. 1.
- 2. This Order in Council shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.
- 3. The importation is prohibited, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs, of bank-notes of the Bank of England or of banks in Scotland or Northern Ireland.
