THE CUSTOMS IMPORT PROHIBITION ORDER 1942, NO. 2

At the Government House at Wellington, this 23rd day of December, 1942.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to section 46 of the Customs Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of the opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition Order 1942, No. 2.
- 2. This Order shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.
- 3. The importation is prohibited, save with the written consent of the Minister of Internal Affairs, of any living animal other than "poultry" as defined by the Poultry Act, 1924, and "stock" as defined by the Stock Act, 1908.
