THE CUSTOMS IMPORT PROHIBITION ORDER 1948, NO. 1

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 12th day of
May, 1948

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 46 of the Customs Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of the opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition Order 1948, No. 1.
2. This Order shall come into force on the seventh day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof.
3. The Customs Import Prohibition Order 1939, No. 2,* is revoked.
4. The importation is prohibited, save with the written consent of the Minister of Customs, and subject to such conditions as it may be thought fit to impose, of eggs of domestic fowls, of ducks, of geese, and of turkeys.
