**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 19th day of June 1978

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 48 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of the opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

---

**ORDER**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition (Sugar) Order 1978.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1978.

**2. Importation prohibited**—The importation of the goods specified in the Schedule hereto is hereby prohibited, except with the consent of the Minister of Customs and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit to impose.

**SCHEDULE**

**PROHIBITED IMPORTS**

Sugar in any of its recognised commercial forms derived from sugar cane or sugar beet.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

The purpose of this order is to give full effect to the International Sugar Agreement 1977 by prohibiting the importation of sugar otherwise than through internationally approved channels.
