

THE CUSTOMS IMPORT PROHIBITION (COFFEE) ORDER 1980, AMENDMENT NO. 1

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 26th day of March 1984

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. SIR ROBERT MULDOON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to section 48 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition (Coffee) Order 1980, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Customs Import Prohibition (Coffee) Order 1980* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).
- (2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Importation of coffee—The Schedule to the principal order is hereby amended by omitting the words "20 kg of soluble or liquid coffee", and substituting the words "23 kg of soluble or liquid coffee".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order amends the Schedule to the principal order by allowing quantities of soluble or liquid coffee not exceeding 23 kg to be imported. Previously, 20 kg was the maximum of soluble or liquid coffee which could be imported.
