



**THE CUSTOMS IMPORT PROHIBITION (ARGENTINA)
ORDER 1982**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 19th day of April 1982

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. D. S. THOMSON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 48 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition (Argentina) Order 1982.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Importation from Argentina—The importation of any goods that are the produce or manufacture of, or are exported from, Argentina is hereby prohibited, except with the consent of the Minister of Customs and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit to impose.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order prohibits the importation of any goods that are the produce or manufacture of, or are exported from, Argentina except with the consent of the Minister of Customs and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit to impose.
