**THE CUSTOMS IMPORT PROHIBITION (ASBESTOS)
ORDER 1984**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 19th day
of March 1984

THE RIGHT HON. D. MACINTYRE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 48 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition (Asbestos) Order 1984.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1984.

2. Importation of asbestos—The importation of the goods specified in the Schedule hereto is hereby prohibited, except with the consent of the Minister of Health and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit to impose.

1. Amosite, in its raw fibrous state.
2. Crocidolite, in its raw fibrous state.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order prohibits the importation of asbestos into New Zealand, except with the consent of the Minister of Health and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit to impose.
