

# THE CUSTOMS IMPORT PROHIBITION (SANCTIONS) ORDER 1985

## ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 2nd day of December 1985

## HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 48 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

### ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition (Sanctions) Order 1985.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- **2. Import sanctions**—The importation of South African goods specified in the Schedule hereto is hereby prohibited, except with the consent of the Minister of Customs and subject to such conditions as the Minister thinks fit to impose.

## **SCHEDULE**

## PROHIBITED IMPORTS

- 1. Arms, ammunition, and military vehicles.
- 2. Gold krugerrands.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order prohibits the importation of South African arms, ammunition, military vehicles, and gold krugerrands into New Zealand, except with the consent of the Minister of Customs and subject to such conditions as the Minister thinks fit to impose.
