ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 23rd day of June 1986

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. G. W. R. PALMER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 48 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition (Wheat) Order 1986.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1986.

2. Import of goods prohibited—The importation of the goods specified in the Schedule to this order is hereby prohibited, except with the consent of the Minister of Customs and subject to such conditions as the Minister thinks fit to impose.

3. Expiry of order—This order shall expire on the 31st day of January 1987.

4. Revocation—The Customs Prohibition Order Prohibiting the Importation of Wheat and Wheatflour and Similar Preparations of Wheat (C. No. 150) dated the 11th day of March 1936* is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order revokes the prohibition on wheatflour and similar preparations of wheat but maintains those controls on the importation of wheat into New Zealand until 31 January 1987, except with the consent of the Minister of Customs and subject to such conditions as the Minister thinks fit to impose.
