**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At Wellington this 21st day of April 1987

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 48 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

**ORDER**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition (Sanctions) Order 1987.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Import sanctions**—The importation of goods, the produce or manufacture of the Republic of South Africa or Namibia, specified in the Schedule to this order, is hereby prohibited, except with the consent of the Minister of Customs and subject to such conditions as the Minister thinks fit to impose.

**3. Revocation**—The Customs Import Prohibition (Sanctions) Order 1986\* is hereby revoked.

## SCHEDULE

## PROHIBITED IMPORTS

1. All goods classified within Chapters 1 to 24 of the New Zealand Customs Tariff.
2. Arms, ammunition, and military vehicles.
3. Gold coins.
4. Coal, lignite, peat, coke, and similar goods classified within headings 27.01 to 27.04 of the New Zealand Customs Tariff.
5. Uranium metal, compounds, and ore.
6. Iron and steel in primary forms classified within headings 73.01 to 73.20 of the New Zealand Customs Tariff.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order prohibits the importation of uranium, coal, and iron and steel in primary forms, the produce or manufacture of the Republic of South Africa or Namibia into New Zealand, and also consolidates the prohibitions covered by the Customs Import Prohibition (Sanctions) Order 1986, being items 1, 2, and 3 of the Schedule to the Order.
