PURSUANT to section 48 of the Customs Act 1966, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition (Sanctions) Order 1987, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Customs Import Prohibition (Sanctions) Order 1987* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).
- (2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.
- 2. Sanctions removed—The Schedule to the principal order is hereby amended by revoking items 1, 3, 4, 5, and 6.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order removes all existing sanctions on imports from South Africa other than the import prohibition on arms, ammunition, and military vehicles.
