ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 16th day of May 1988

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 48 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition (Chlorofluorocarbons) Order 1988.
 - (2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1988.
- **2. Importation of chlorofluorocarbons**—The importation of the goods specified in the Schedule hereto, whether existing alone or in a mixture, excluding any such substance or mixture that is in a manufactured product (not being a manufactured product that is a container that is used for the transportation or storage of the goods so specified), is hereby prohibited, except with the consent of the Minister of Trade and Industry and subject to such conditions as the Minister thinks fit

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 July 1988, will permit New Zealand to give effect to its commitments under the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Harm the Ozone Layer by prohibiting the importation of certain chlorofluorocarbons.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 19 May 1988. This order is administered in the Customs Department.
