THE CUSTOMS IMPORT PROHIBITION ORDER (NO. 2) 1951

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 46 of the Customs Act 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of the opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition Order (No. 2) 1951.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day following the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. The importation is prohibited, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs, of seeds, grain, nuts, and other agricultural produce in used or secondhand bags or sacks.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*]

As a safeguard against the introduction of animal diseases through used or secondhand bags or sacks, certain conditions have been attached, since May 1945, to all licences under the Import Control Regulations 1938 granted for agricultural produce imported in bags or sacks.

The order is intended to provide authority for the continued application of the conditions in the case of agricultural produce now exempted from the requirement of a licence under the Import Control Regulations.
