THE CUSTOMS IMPORT PROHIBITION ORDER (NO. 3) 1952

At the Government House at Wellington, this 23rd day of July 1952 Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to section 46 of the Customs Act 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of the opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition Order (No. 3) 1952.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day following the date

of its notification in the Gazette.

2. The importation is prohibited, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit to impose, of ultrasonic therapy apparatus, being any device suitable for application to the human body and capable of transmitting thereto mechanical vibrations of the order of 600,000 cycles per second or more.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.]

This order is intended to control the importation of ultrasonic therapy apparatus so as to ensure that it will not be obtained by unskilled persons in whose hands its improper use might result in danger to those undergoing treatment by this means.
