

THE CUSTOMS IMPORT PROHIBITION (MAGNETIC WRISTLETS AND ANKLETS) ORDER 1960

Pursuant to section 46 of the Customs Act 1913, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of the opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Import Prohibition (Magnetic Wristlets and Anklets) Order 1960.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- 2. The importation is prohibited of the goods known as Doctor Ring Magnetic Wristlets or Anklets, and of advertising matter relating solely or principally to those goods.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. This order imposes a total prohibition on the importation of a device known as the "Doctor Ring", and of advertising matter relating solely or principally thereto.
