**THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE REGULATIONS 1954,
AMENDMENT NO. 3**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 2nd day of October 1972

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Criminal Justice Act 1954, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Criminal Justice Regulations 1954, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Criminal Justice Regulations 1954* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Forms—Form 19 in the Schedule to the principal regulations (as added by regulation 3 of the Criminal Justice Regulations 1954, Amendment No. 2) is hereby amended by omitting the last paragraph, and substituting the following paragraphs:

“This is to direct you, the said constables, to take the defendant and deliver him/her to the hospital, and you, the said superintendent, to receive him/her into your custody and detain him/her in accordance with the order.

“Unless an order for the defendant’s removal from hospital and return to custody is sooner made, you, the said superintendent, are hereby required to have him/her brought to the Supreme (or Magistrate’s) Court at at a.m. (p.m.) on the above-mentioned date.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend form 19 in the Schedule to the principal regulations (Order for Defendant's Committal to Psychiatric Hospital for Detention and Examination) in order to provide for cases where an order for the defendant's removal from the psychiatric hospital and return to custody is made before the date set for the adjourned hearing.
