ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 15th day of June 1981

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 3 (1) (b) of the Civil List Act 1979, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Civil List Order 1981.

(2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 28th day of January 1981.

2. Allowance of Governor-General—The allowance for expenses that is payable to the Governor-General, pursuant to section 3 (1) (b) of the Civil List Act 1979, shall be paid—

(a) In respect of the period beginning on the 28th day of January 1981 and ending with the close of the 31st day of March 1981, at the rate of \$15,294 for that period; and

(b) On and after the 1st day of April 1981, at the rate of \$66,946 a year.

3. Revocation—The Civil List Order 1980* is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order increases from \$54,072 a year to \$66,946 a year the rate at which the Governor-General's allowance for expenses is payable.

The rate fixed in respect of the period beginning on 28 January 1981 and ending with the close of 31 March 1981 has the effect of giving the present incumbent the benefit of the new rate of \$66,946 a year as from 14 October 1980, the date on which he became entitled, under section 3 (3) of the Civil List Act 1979, to the allowance. The period in respect of which the previous incumbent was entitled, under section 3 (4) of the Civil List Act 1979, to the allowance ended on 27 January 1981.
