ORDER IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 14 (2) of the Chiropractors Act 1982, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Chiropractors Order 1984.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1984.

2. Recognised qualifications—(1) Paragraph (b) of the First Schedule to the Chiropractors Act 1982 is hereby amended by inserting, in their appropriate alphabetical order, the following items:

“The Cleveland College of Chiropractic, California:

“The North Western College of Chiropractic, Minnesota:

“The Palmer College of Chiropractic—West, California.”

(2) Paragraph (b) of the First Schedule to the Chiropractors Act 1982 is hereby amended by omitting the item relating to “The International College of Chiropractic, Australia”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order which amends the First Schedule to the Chiropractors Act 1982 comes into force on 1 April 1984. The principal effect of the order is that degrees of Doctor of Chiropractic obtained from the 3 specified institutions are qualifications that may lead to registration under the Act.

The reference to the International College of Chiropractic, Australia is omitted because that institution is now combined with the Phillip Institute of Technology, Melbourne, Australia.
