THE CINEMATOGRAPH OPERATORS LICENSING REGULATIONS 1938, AMENDMENT NO. 3

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Cinematograph Films Act, 1928, as amended by section 18 of the Statutes Amendment Act, 1936, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Cinematograph Operators Licensing Regulations 1938, Amendment No. 3.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Cinematograph Operators Licensing Regulations 1938* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. Clause 5 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking subclauses (a) and (b), and substituting the following therefor:—

"(a) It shall not be lawful for any person to project cinematograph film or assist in the projection of cinematograph film in any theatre unless he is the holder of an appropriate license in that behalf issued under and in accordance with the provisions of these regulations:

"(b) It shall not be lawful for any person to employ any other person to project cinematograph film or assist in the projection of cinematograph film who is not the holder of an appropriate license in that behalf issued pursuant to these regulations."
