THE CONTROL OF SHIPBUILDING NOTICE 1942

PURSUANT to the Supply Control Emergency Regulations 1939* and the Munitions Emergency Regulations 1941†, I, Daniel Giles Sullivan, Minister of Supply and Munitions, hereby give notice as follows:—

1. This notice may be cited as the Control of Shipbuilding Notice 1942.

2. Barges, hulks, mining dredges, floating cranes, and other vessels or things made to float, whether or not they are fixed or free and whether or not they have any means of propulsion, are declared to be munitions for the purposes of the Munitions Emergency Regulations 1941†.

3. The functions and powers vested in me and in the Munitions Controller by virtue of the Supply Control Emergency Regulations 1939* and the Munitions Emergency Regulations 1941†, in so far as they may relate to the construction of ships or to vessels or things of a class referred to in the last preceding clause, are hereby delegated to the person appointed by me and for the time being holding office as the Controller of Shipbuilding.

4. Nothing in the last preceding clause shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the functions or powers of the Munitions Controller in so far as they may relate to munitions other than munitions of any class referred to in that clause.
