THE CUSTOMS PRIMAGE (PAINTS AND RELATED PRODUCTS) EXEMPTION ORDER 1957

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 25th day of September 1957

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1931, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Primage (Paints and Related Products) Exemption Order 1957.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 27th day of September 1957.

2. The classes of goods set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from the primage duty imposed by section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1931.

3. The Customs Primage Exemption Order 1937, No. 1* is hereby amended by omitting from the Schedule the words "red lead and".
