## THE CUSTOMS PRIMAGE (CABLE AND WIRE) EXEMPTION ORDER 1956

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1931, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

#### ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Primage (Cable and Wire) Exemption Order 1956.
  - (2) This order shall come into force on the 10th day of August 1956.
- 2. (1) The classes of goods set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from the primage duty imposed by section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1931.
- (2) The Order in Council\* dated the 28th day of August 1936, exempting certain goods from primage duty, is hereby amended by omitting from the Schedule the words "(7) Insulated cable and wire; carbon in block, sheet, or rod; mica, vulcanite, insulating-tape, and other insulating materials n.e.i., nct including insulating-piping or tubing, or insulating fittings for pipes" and "(10) Wire, metal, plain, n.e.i., barbed fencing-wire; wire cut to lengths, looped, twisted, or plain, suited for baling and similar purposes", and "(11) Metal cordage, not being gold or silver".
