**THE CUSTOMS PRIMAGE (CABLE AND WIRE) EXEMPTION  
ORDER 1956**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 8th day of August 1956

**Present:**

**HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL**

PURSUANT to section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1931, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

---

**ORDER**

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Primage (Cable and Wire) Exemption Order 1956.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 10th day of August 1956.

2. (1) The classes of goods set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from the primage duty imposed by section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1931.

(2) The Order in Council\* dated the 28th day of August 1936, exempting certain goods from primage duty, is hereby amended by omitting from the Schedule the words "(7) Insulated cable and wire; carbon in block, sheet, or rod; mica, vulcanite, insulating-tape, and other insulating materials n.e.i., not including insulating-piping or tubing, or insulating fittings for pipes" and "(10) Wire, metal, plain, n.e.i., barbed fencing-wire; wire cut to lengths, looped, twisted, or plain, suited for baling and similar purposes", and "(11) Metal cordage, not being gold or silver".
