

THE CUSTOMS PRIMAGE (LEATHER) EXEMPTION ORDER 1957

PURSUANT to section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1931, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Primage (Leather) Exemption Order 1957.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the 8th day of February
- 2. The classes of goods set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from the primage duty imposed by section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1931.
