PURSUANT to section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1931, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Primage (Hatmakers' Materials) Exemption Order 1957.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 7th day of June 1957.

2. The classes of goods set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from the primage duty imposed by section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1931.

SCHEDULE

GOODS EXEMPTED FROM PRIMAGE DUTY

Tariff Item No.	Classes of Goods
164	Hatmakers' materials, viz.: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) Hat-hoods, felt, of wool or fur, or containing fur, <i>unblocked</i> and unsewn. (2) <i>Hat-hoods</i> and <i>hat-shapes</i>, other kinds, <i>not sewn, cut, decorated, or otherwise worked</i>, on declaration by a manufacturer that they will be <i>blocked or shaped</i> and used by him in the manufacture of hats. (4) Other kinds, as may be approved by the Minister and on such conditions as he may prescribe.
