## THE CUSTOMS PRIMAGE ORDER, 1936, NO. 2.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council.

Acts pursuant to which the regulations were made: Sections 12 and

31 of the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, and section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1931.

Date of enactment: 30th day of September, 1936.

Date of notification in Gazette: 1st day of October, 1936.

- This order may be cited as the Customs Primage Order, 1936,
   No. 2.
- 2. Whereas by section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1931, primage duty was imposed on certain goods including the classes of goods set out in the First Schedule hereto, and whereas by Order in Council made on the 14th day of June, 1934,\* the classes of goods set out in the First Schedule hereto were exempted from the said primage duty. Now, therefore, the exemption effected by the said Order in Council of date the 14th day of June, 1934, is hereby revoked, and the said Order in Council is hereby revoked accordingly.
- 3. The classes of goods set out in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from the primage duty aforesaid.
- 4. This Order in Council shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of September, 1936.

REVOCATION OF EXEMPTIONS FROM PRIMAGE DUTY.
LEAD in ingots or pigs.

## SECOND SCHEDULE.

EXEMPTIONS FROM PRIMAGE DUTY.

COPPER, iron, lead, tin, and other metal, in billets, blooms, ingots, or pigs.
