Pursuant to section 18 of the Customs Act 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Port of Entry (Oamaru) Closing Order 1965.
 - (2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1966.
- 2. It is hereby declared that the port of Oamaru, as defined in the Second Schedule to the Customs Regulations 1959,* shall cease to be a port of entry for the purposes of the Customs Act 1913.
- 3. The Second Schedule to the Cutoms Regulations 1959* is hereby consequentially amended by revoking so much thereof as relates to Oamaru.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of this order is that the port of Oamaru will cease to be a Customs port of entry on 1 January 1966.
