THE CUSTOMS PORTS OF ENTRY ORDER 1962

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 30th day of May 1962

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 18 of the Customs Act 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Ports of Entry Order 1962.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1962.

2. The places mentioned in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be ports of entry for the purposes of the Customs Act 1913 (in addition to the ports of entry specified in the Second Schedule to the Customs Regulations 1959*); and the ports of entry hereby declared shall be known by the names set forth in the first column and have the limits defined in the second column of the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

PORTS OF ENTRY

Name	Limits
Hamilton	All that portion of land, river, and lake comprised within the limits of the city of Hamilton.
Palmerston North	All that portion of land and river comprised within the limits of the city of Palmerston North.

SCHEDULE—*continued*

Name	Limits
Whangarei	All the waters of Whangarei Harbour inside a straight line drawn from Busby Head to the northern bank of the mouth of the Ruakaka River, together with the land abutting thereon to a distance of one mile from high-water mark and that comprised in the borough of Whangarei.
