PURSUANT to the Crimes Act 1961 and to section 100A of the Judicature Act 1908 (as substituted by section 11 (1) of the Judicature Amendment Act (No. 2) 1985), His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Criminal Proceedings (Enforcement of Fines) Fee Regulations 1987.
 - (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1987.
- 2. Court fee in respect of warrant to collect fine or other sum of money ordered to be paid.—The Court fee payable in respect of every warrant to collect a fine or other sum of money issued under section 19c of the Crimes Act 1961 (which warrant is required by rule 4 (1) of the Criminal Proceedings (Enforcement of Fines) Rules 1967* to be in form 3 in the Schedule to those rules) shall be \$50.

3. Revocation—The Criminal Proceedings (Enforcement of Fines) Rules 1967 are hereby consequentially amended by revoking subclause (2) of rule 4.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 April 1987, increase from \$1.50 to \$50 the Court fee payable in respect of every warrant to collect a fine or other sum of money issued under section 19c of the Crimes Act 1961.
