THE CUSTOMS (TARIFF PREFERENCE ON MOTOR-VEHICLES) REGULATIONS 1940.

Pursuant to section 309 of the Customs Act, 1913, and to section 30 of the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Customs (Tariff Preference on Motor-vehicles) Regulations 1940.
- 2. Notwithstanding anything in Regulation 9 or 10 of the Customs (Tariff Preference and General) Regulations 1936,* if, with respect to any motor-vehicle entitled to be entered under Item No. 389 (a) of the Customs Tariff, the Minister of Customs is satisfied that in the assembly of such motor-vehicle in New Zealand parts which he may from time to time specify and which have been produced or manufactured in New Zealand are used instead of parts which would ordinarily be imported into New Zealand with such motor-vehicle, and that because such parts are not imported therewith such motor-vehicle is not entitled to be entered as the produce or manufacture of any country referred to in the aforesaid regulations, he may, at his discretion, permit the entry of such motor-vehicle as if such parts had been imported therewith.
